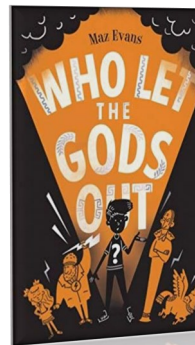
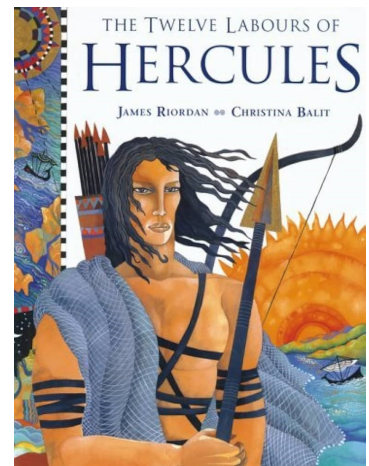


Ancient Greece

We shall be reading the novel by Maz Evans *Who Let The Gods Out?* as our whole class read.

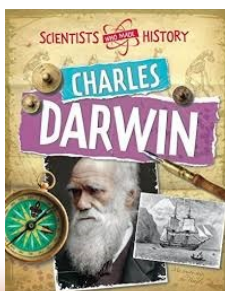
